Math 21002-001: Applied Linear Algebra Spring 2024

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Course prerequisites: Math 11012 Intuitive Calculus or 12002 Analytic Geometry and Calculus I or Math 12012 Calculus with Precalculus or Math 12021 Calculus for Life Sciences with a minimum C grade.

Textbook: Linear Algebra by S. Lipschutz and M. Lipson, Sixth Edition, McGraw Hill, 2018

Office hours: Monday, Wednesday and Friday 1:00 pm -2:15 pm and by appointment.

Course description from catalog: Systems of linear equations and the associated matrix operations, linear transformations, vector spaces, bases, eigenvectors.

Learning outcomes: At the end of this course the students will be expected to learn basics language of linear algebra and learn basic operations with vectors and matrices.

Core material to be covered (Selected topics from Chapters 1–9 of the textbook):

- 1. Linear Equations;
- 2. Matrix Algebra;
- 3. Determinants;
- 4. Vector Spaces;
- 5. Linear Mappings;
- 6. Orthogonality;
- 7. Eigenvalues and Eigenvectors.

Enrollment/official registration: The official registration deadline for this course is January 22, 2024.
